Interactive Education Modules

Social Media Captions and Tweets

- Distracted Driving is anytime two eyes are not on the road, two hands are not on the wheel, your mind is not focused on your driving, or when your ears are not alert to your surroundings. Be sure to put all distractions away before you start to drive. @impactdrivers
- We lose about 4,000 teens every year to reckless and distracted driving. That is equivalent to 11 teens a day. These are not sad accidents, but 100% preventable crashes. Be sure to make good decisions each ride. Your choices matter. @impactdrivers
- It is up to you as a driver or passenger to make the right choices in a car. Buckle up properly, follow the rules of the road, speak up if you feel unsafe in the car, and make good decisions each ride. @impactdrivers
- Take the pledge to commit to being a safe driver and passenger in the car each ride. Visit ImpactTeenDrivers.org to take the pledge! @impactdrivers
- 50% of the teens we lose in car crashes each year were passengers being driven by another teen driver. Passenger safety is just as important as driver safety. @impactdrivers
- 90% of teen drivers say they would stop texting while driving if a passenger asked them to stop. Make sure to use your voice if you ever feel unsafe in the car. You could be the one who saves your own life! #WhatAboutYou? @impactdrivers


